Constitution of the Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto:

• Article I: Name

The official name of this recognized campus group is "Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto". The acronym of this group is "WSD@UofT"

• Article II: Purpose

The purpose of this club is to promote the appreciation and understanding of wolfram technologies and its applications among students and the wider community. The club aims to provide opportunities for members to learn new programming concepts, skills, and techniques, to engage in mathematical problem-solving and exploration, to participate in code-based competitions and events, and to interact with other coding enthusiasts.

• Article III: Membership

Membership in this club is open to all students who have an interest in mathematics and who agree to abide by the constitution and by-laws of the club. Members are expected to attend regular meetings, pay annual dues as determined by the club officers, and participate in club activities and events.

• Article IV: Officers

The officers of this club shall consist of two Co-Presidents, an Outreach/Event Director, a Social Media Director, a Technical Director. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the members present at the annual general meeting in September. The term of office shall be one academic year. The duties of the officers are as follows:

- The Co-Presidents shall share the responsibility of presiding over all meetings of the club, representing the club in external affairs, appointing committees as needed, and overseeing the general operation of the club.
- The Outreach/Event Director shall plan and organize the club's activities and events, such as workshops, seminars, competitions, and socials, and liaise with other clubs and organizations on campus or in the community.
- The Technical Director shall provide technical support and guidance to the club members, such as teaching new mathematical software or tools, troubleshooting technical issues, and maintaining the club's equipment and resources.

• Article V: Meetings

The club shall hold regular meetings at least once a month during the academic year. The time and place of the meetings shall be determined by the officers and announced to the members in advance. Special meetings may be called by either Co-President or by a petition signed by at least 10% of the members.

Article VI: Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any general meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given to all members at least two weeks before the meeting. Any amendment must also be approved by the Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto before it takes effect.

• Article VII: Affiliation

This club is affiliated with Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto as a sub-group under its constitution. This club agrees to abide by Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto's policies and procedures as well as those of the University of Toronto. This club also agrees to support Wolfram Student Developers of the University of Toronto's mission statement and objectives.
